# The Law for Students with Disabilities

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## Individuals with Disabilities Education Act

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**IDEA**: All children (through age 21) with a disability...

An "appropriate" education means one that allows a student to...

### What is an IEP?



- Individualized
- Legally binding (like a contract)
  - Everything on the IEP must be given to the student
- Created at IEP meeting
- Good for one year
