Right to Be in School



You **must** stay in school

Until the end of the school year in which you turn

You **may** stay in school


Until the end of the school year in which you turn

Push-Out Can Include






Before discharging you to a GED program, your school must





- January, June & August 2021
- January 2022

Students got COVID-19 exemptions from those Regents

Students with exemptions do NOT need to (re)take those Regents

*In NYC (and many other districts) you are "compulsory age" *until* the July 1st *after* your 17th birthday

Documents Needed for Accommodations

Document (e.g. IEP) must describe:

- My diagnosis
- How my diagnosis impacts my ability to take tests
- What test accommodations I need

Documents must be current

I to 5 years old, depending on disability
