

Free Appropriate Public Education (FAPE)



- FAPE = services tailored to a student's needs
- Must provide a meaningful benefit
- Helps the student progress

"A Chevy, not a Cadillac"









Least Restrictive Environment (LRE)

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- Goal is inclusion
- As much as possible, students with disabilities learn with students who do not have disabilities





To be Eligible: Classifications



13 Classifications of disability...

- > Autism
- Deafness
- Deaf-Blindness
- > Emotional Disturbance
- > Hearing Impairment
- Learning Disability
- > Intellectual Disability

- Multiple Disabilities
- Orthopedic Impairment
- > Other Health Impairment
- Speech or Language Imp.
- > Traumatic Brain Injury
- > Visual Impairment

Children ages 3-5 will be classified as a "preschool student with a disability."

Evaluations: COVID 19



- Remote Evaluations? Yes! On a case-by-case basis
- IEP meeting can be held with current information, but another meeting must follow once assessments are completed.
- School closings do not pause IDEA timelines (for the most part).



What Should an Evaluation Include?



Students must be tested in all areas of suspected disability

Evaluations During COVID-19



IDEA still applies

- Consent must be written, voluntary, and informed!
- Evaluate within 60 calendar days of consent
- Ask for evaluation at any time
- Evaluate in all areas of suspected disability

Complications

 Evaluations (especially cognitive) are tough to complete remotely

- Individualized
- Committee
- COVID-19: By Phone!
- Legally binding (like a contract)
 - If it's on the IEP, it's mandated!
- Good for one year

Have right to 7 days notice

If the student is or may be in general ed classes

School Psychologist

Explains evaluations or change in setting

District Representative N

Knows district services

Student

Other Persons

Including interpreters

As appropriate (15 or older)





Call AFC's helpline:

School refuses to conduct an IEP meeting

School will not recommend any services until schools reopen and/or evaluations are conducted

School says it cannot consider any changes to an IEP until schools reopen and/or evaluations are conducted

Implementation During COVID-19 Related Services

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Services will be remote

Provider must reach out to make a remote plan

You must have the chance to provide input about that plan



Implementation During COVID-19: New Placements

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New placements are still an option

If switching schools, the DOE will send a school location letter

The new school will reach out with a contact number

You can't visit the new school now, but you can talk to staff there and ask questions



Implementation: Timeline

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has 60
calendar
days from
your consent
to:

- Evaluate
- Hold the IEP meeting



Implementation During COVID-19

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You STILL have the right to:

- A placement before the start of school
- If you need a placement now, the DOE should find one as soon as possible



Implementation: Know Your Rights



If no provider is available for services -> related services authorization (RSA)

If no specialized classroom is available -> PI letter may be appropriate

Facilitated IEP Meeting







Mediation



Formal Dispute Resolution



Mediation

Impartial Hearing

- Voluntary meeting.
- Parent and DOE discuss the problem.
- A mediator facilitates.
- Parties control the outcome
- Parties may still go to an Impartial Hearing

- Is a legal proceeding.
- An Impartial Hearing Officer (IHO) in charge.
- Written decision based on:
 - Witnesses
 - Documents
- Can appeal decision



Advocacy Tips During COVID-19

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Pay attention to timelines

Keep a list of contacts you've spoken with

Keep/ask for copies of your IEP and your RLP

Track the services you child actually gets

Reach out to the DOE for help
